Update on Riscilla or You can tell them the truth but that does not mean they will listenby Dennis

Riscilla started out at Desert Christian High School a little behind the average student but with hard work, tutoring and sound advice from her host families, her teaches and Lucy and me she blossomed and became an excellent student. Her grades were good, she had sweet friends and become active in sports and in her host families' lives. Her hard work paid off, she overcame missing her home on the Reservation, and gained confidence. She grew in her faith and knowledge of the Bible.

When she became a junior, Lucy and I started seriously reminding her of her upcoming graduation and going off to college where she would be "on her own." Along with Lucy and me she was given sound advice from a variety of people including host parents and Native American advisors at Northern Arizona University. She was warned many times of the dangers of being alone with no one to look over her shoulder to keep her on track, classmates that were more interested in partying or goofing off than studying, and the new freedom she would have that was a new experience for her.

This first year Riscilla was attending NAU we kept in contact with her (phone, texts, email and visits), tried to monitor her grades, health and emotional stability. The response was always "I am doing fine, classes are difficult but I am doing OK and I am studying a lot."

Then, a couple weeks after the end of NAU spring classes, we received a notice that Riscilla was not being invited back to NAU because her grade average was not up to standard! (She had a 1.89 and needed a 2.0) What a shock and a let-down! This was heart-breaking and disappointing news for not just Lucy and me, but for many that have been praying, supporting and rooting for her to succeed!

Riscilla says she does not know what happened; she thought she was doing OK! She was warned that it would be a difficult first year and to put all her effort into her studies. But just maybe if she would have spent her extra time studying, instead of spending time on FaceBook posts (some late at night) and taking road trips with her friends to see the sights around northern Arizona, she would have had a better grade average and returned to NAU this fall. "You can take a horse to water but you can't make them drink."

We are continuing to pray for Riscilla and to offer support and advice to her if she asks, however, Riscilla is in control of her future. What she does now is up to her. She can attend a community college, bring up her grades and re-apply to enroll at NAU again, if she chooses. At this point she says she will be enrolling it Northland Pioneer College (NPC) in Whiteriver to get a CNA (Certified Nursing Assistant) certificate. We had asked her to get a full-time job this summer to begin contributing to her college housing expenses. We have not seen evidence of a job yet and have told her that we will not be financially supporting her education at this time. We need to see her investing personally into her own education and showing improved grades.

Some more sad news...by Lucy

Some of you may remember that when we brought Thearsa and Naomi to visit Desert Christian schools 4 years ago we also brought another young lady, Nicole, from the Reservation. Unfortunately, even though we had a wonderful host family lined up, Nicole chose not to come to Tucson. Her life has been a mess ever since. And now,

at the age of 16, she gave birth to Deleana on June 9th in Show Low, AZ. I spent time in the hospital with Nicole and her 18-year-old boyfriend, D'Angelo, as they began to learn to parent their new baby. I spoke candidly with D'Angelo about his responsibility to now provide for these two precious women in his life. He is enrolled in (but hasn't started yet) a program to help him get off weed. He then needs to take online classes to get his GED and THEN get a job. I prayed with him and gave them a Bible.

When I followed up with Nicole after their release from the hospital she was struggling as they were living with relatives in over-crowded homes and combating bedbug-infested sleeping quarters. I asked Nicole to pray about whether it might be better for Deleana if she made a plan for adoption. I spoke of the young women I know who loved their babies so much that they chose to give them a home, family, education and future they could never provide. Some have gone on to finish their own education, get married and THEN have children when they had a stable marriage and home. Nicole said she would consider and pray about it. I haven't heard from her in a couple weeks.

Jacy attended Desert Christian School for her 8th grade year. She began at the high school and then was caught breaking one of our 'no tolerance rules' and had to return to the Reservation. We offered the opportunity for Jacy to return to Desert with repentance and agreement to abide by the rules. She chose not to return. Jacy continued high school and graduated from Alchesay in Whiteriver in May. We have kept in touch with Jacy and recently heard that she was pregnant! Oh dear! I was able to meet with Jacy briefly in Whiteriver in June. She reported that she is living with her boyfriend, Brodrick, and his mother. Brodrick

dropped out of high school and does not have a job. She asked for prayer for him to break his addiction to drugs and get a job to support their baby.
