### 28 families in Puerto Peñasco receive Christmas Dinner Food Boxes

The word went out to Manos de Dios supporters. "There are families living just four hours south of Tucson, AZ that will not be able to have a special Christmas meal this year." The difficult economy in both the US and Mexico, as well as the violence due to the aggressive drug cartels have left many families without jobs to provide for their families. Hearts were touched and donations came in to Manos de Dios to provide Christmas Dinner Food boxes.

We (Dennis & Lucy) traveled to Puerto Peñasco to shop for the food and deliver the gifts to the families. We compiled a list of families in need, consulting with pastors and local missionaries, Pat & Gerry. We prayed over the list of families, many of which we know personally.

Next, we went SHOPPING! We purchased the pazole (hominy), tostadas, fresh vegetables and fruit to make meñudo, a traditional Mexican soup. Pat and Gerry shopped for the 5 types of meat needed to make meñudo to include in the food box! We also purchased household items that we were certain the families would need...bar soap, dish soap, toilet paper, toothpaste and laundry soap. Pat & Gerry and Karen & Mark (new missionaries in Peñasco...yeah, more Kingdom workers!) purchased 8 turkeys!

Bright and early the next morning we picked up Pastors Lupe & Rafaela at El Sembrador church. They went with us to the three families from their church who were to receive food boxes. The families were so surprised and overwhelmed by the goodness of God! They tearfully reported that they had nothing to fix for a Christmas meal this year. We shared that we were there to

# Prison Posada December 2010

This year's Prison Posada was quite a bit different. With a new Commandant (warden) being in charge and our not being able to work with him as easily as we have with the previous one, changes had to be made. We were not able to do a Posada for ALL the prisoners this year. Instead, we were permitted to extend the weekly two hour Bible study to four hours for a Christmas Posada. About 130 men were invited to a meal of Carne Asada (with all the fixings), tortillas, coffee, juice and, (most importantly) a variety of pies for dessert (23 were donated).

The Posada began with the singing of praise and worship songs led by a worship team made up of all prisoners. Prayers and a message from the 'Pastor' of the prisoners (an inmate) followed. Pat, Gustavo, Roberto and I (all from the outside) were also asked to give our testimony or a message to the men and we gladly accepted. A team of prisoners cooked the meat (that we brought in) on huge grills and delicious Carne Asada tacos, with all the fixings, were served. The pies were cut and each prisoner enjoyed a generous serving! After the program, the men were given a variety of small Christmas gifts and any leftover food that was available.

During the program, one of the men sat down with me and wanted to talk. (I have visited with him in the past). He stated that he would be getting released soon and he was frightened about getting out of prison because he had been in so long and did not know what to do or how to act. We discussed the need to not get back into the same situations that sent him to prison, the need to have the right type of friends when he was released, and that the presence of Jesus in his life was mandatory. At the end of our conversation I was able to pray for him, for his family in Nogales, and about the stress of being released and how to handle himself.

Praying for him was the highlight of the Posada for me!

It would be hard to image how difficult it is to be in a prison in Mexico unless you have been able to get a glimpse of it by working with the prisoners as we have. These prisoners live in extremely crowded conditions (a cell that was built for six houses 15 to 18 men), eat poor quality food, have little medical and dental treatments, receive no rehabilitation information, and get limited visitors. The men have to be strong and tough or they will be taken advantage of in many ways. Most of their time is spent milling around and talking tough. With this information in mind, I realized just how much fear this man must have been feeling for him to come to me and admit his fear. I was almost at a loss as to what to do, until I remembered to PRAY!

We realize these men (and women) have violated the law and are paying for their crimes, as they should. However, they are God's children and we need to pray for them (as well as for prisoners all over the world). This is not to negate what they have done, but to pray for a change in their lives. We pray that those who do not know Jesus, will invite Him to save their lives. We share with them that that they can become born again and thus become a 'new creation'. God gives us all this opportunity! So Lucy and I ask you to join us in praying for prisoners both inside and outside prison walls.


Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!

One of the things we are working on while being home in Tucson for a while is strengthening our marriage. I asked God to show me how I needed to change. Through the Love & Respect conference and teaching God is clearly showing me that I have not been showing my husband the

honor and respect I need to. I have repented to Dennis and to God and am purposefully focusing on changing my attitude, words, and tone of voice. I am told in God's Word that showing respect to my husband is a *command* to me as a wife. ("However, each one of you also must love his wife as he loves himself, and *the wife must respect her husband*." Ephesians 5:33 ) This respect is 'unconditional respect', not based on my husband's behavior. My choosing to show respect to my husband is one way to show reverence to my Lord. When I show my husband respect it is 'as unto the Lord'.

The Love & Respect material gives practical examples of HOW to carry out this principle in every day life. And, guess what? It works! When I treat my husband respectfully and with honor, he responds in more loving ways to me. I don't do it for this, but it is a wonderful result of following God's principles. And we get on what Love & Respect author, Dr. Emerson Eggerichs calls the "Energizing Cycle" instead of the "Crazy Cycle"!

Dennis and I are sharing the Love & Respect Conference on DVD with friends two weekends in January in Tucson, as well as facilitating the DVD conference at one of our supporting churches in February.
