She easily engages people in conversations and shares with them Jesus' love, joy and grace. She uses her interest in technology and the arts to put together music videos to Christian songs; sends scripture to friends on facebook; and joined the commitment to text "God's Not Dead" to everyone on her contact list after going to see the movie by the same name!

One day in March Drelyn shadowed a student at Desert Christian High School and then joined her sister, Riscilla, at lunch time. She loved the classes, teachers and made some new friends. Dennis and I joined her for an interview in the afternoon. They asked many questions of Drelyn, determining her compatibility with Desert Christian School. They asked us questions such as, "What do you see for Drelyn's future?" Dennis shared his hope that she would finish high school, attend college and then do whatever God led her to do for a career. I shared my vision of a beautiful, strong, mature Apache woman who loves Jesus and shares His love with her people!

We enjoyed a wonderful weekend with Drelyn in Tucson. We rode bikes, had "God times" on the back porch, laughed, swam, and ate! We prayed for her classmates at the boarding school and discussed the "Discovering God" method of disciple-making. She is equipped and ready to encourage her friends to grow in their faith this last quarter of the school year. Who knows where God is going to lead THEM? Drelyn has been accepted to attend Desert Christian High School. We are trusting God to provide a host family for her.

Learning to Listen...by Dennis

Everyone has heard about my double (one from the front, one from the back) spine surgery in October 2013. Now, I will share "the rest of the story" and the personal impact of having three spine surgeries within six months!

The first two to three months of recovery from the October surgery went fine. I was doing the exercises I was told to do by the doctor and physical therapist. However, I did not follow their advise very closely when I started feeling better. I started working heavily. God made man to work and I needed to get back to it! Carrying a five-gallon paint bucket to our roof, painting, remodeling our new mission house, and the list went on. These actions may have had something to do with the increasingly debilitating back and leg pain I experienced in the second three months after my surgery. I finally went to see my spine surgeon in Flagstaff and was diagnosed with a severely herniated disc in my back (just above the previous surgery). I was scheduled for surgery (a laminectomy*) two days later.



Colossians 2:6-7 (NLT)


Again, I have been given advice on what I can and cannot do. Will I listen? Yes! Not because it is sound secular advice, but because it is advice from Christ, my Lord.

God is not punishing me with all this pain and these surgeries for not listening. But what He is doing is teaching me to listen to Him and the sound advice from others, including believers and non-believers. This period of my life is also showing me that I CAN'T GO IT ALONE! From now on I am going to have to rely on others for assistance unless I want to ruin what few discs I have left in my spine!

I am reminded of what I often told our girls in the dorm. "If you ignore sound advice and do what you want you will suffer the consequences: good or bad." With that said, I think the Lord is teaching me to listen and obey. And "Yes, Lord, I will."

Work projects begin at the "Heart House" Ministry headquarters in Show Low, AZ!....by Dennis





March was a busy month for work on our new mission house in Show Low. On Friday the 7th my friends Albert, Ry, Rick, and Dan came up to start work on the remodeling project. There was painting, removing old mirror glass tiles from a wall, raising a recessed floor, adding a new floor to the living room and hallway, installing a fence and gates in the back yard, removing some of the kitchen cabinets and replacing some light fixtures. I had an excellent work crew so more was accomplished than I had hoped! I was not very much help and Dan had to miss working for 5 hours

as he waited for me while I was treated in the emergency room at the local hospital. It seems that for the past two months the recovery from my back surgery has not been going well. I have probably been doing more physical work then I am supposed to and have had severe back pain and problems walking. After 5 hours of tests, two pain perscriptions, and some antibiotics we made it back to the house where we found the guys doing fine without us! I was not much help for the rest of the trip but Dan went right back to work. Those four guys got a lot accomplished in such a short time and Lucy and I can't thank them enough.

Then on Sunday the 16th my friend Jack and I headed back up north to do more remodeling while a plumber was to replace all the pipes under the house. We wound up buying a new hot water heater that was not budgeted for, but was installed at the same time. During the four days Jack and I spent working on the house we were able to finish many projects that included installing new water faucets and plumbing inside the house, installing a new floor in the kitchen and dry wall in the living room, painting, and a variety of small items that needed to be fixed or replaced. That was Jack's third work trip with me to the "Heart House" and needless to say he is a true servant and friend.

With the help and hard work from our friends, we are almost finished with the painting and will be ready (soon I hope) to install carpet and plank flooring, and then we can bring up some furniture. YEA!



Listening to God

My heart's desire is to hear what God is saying. I love God so much and want to be in the center of His will. Journaling is one technique I have found useful to help tune my ears to hear God's voice. I simply begin writing what my heart wants to express to God as I begin my day. I label this "she says" in the margin of my journal. I include praise, thanks, requests and questions. I confess sins and repent, asking for God's help to turn and "go the other way". I record verses that speak to me that day and agree in prayer with them, declaring them over those I am praying for as well as for my own life. I may write out words of a worship song (see side panel). Then, comes the <u>listening part</u>. I apply the most helpful advice I have ever encountered. I came across it a few years ago when reading Becky Tirabassi's book <u>Let God Talk to You</u>. The suggestion is to write "He says" and simply wait. Then begin writing what you sense God saying. So, I purposefully write "He says" in the margin of my journal. I wait and then begin writing what God gives me. I can only say "try it"! I look back at what I have written and am amazed! What I have written is familiar as it often sounds like passages of scripture I have read. The words are loving, insightful and kind. They challenge me and are filled with truth. I look back at what I have written and thank Holy Spirit for communicating with me!

So, with the help of *June* (a wonderful woman from our home church), I have made giving away journals a part of our ministry. The journals she so generously provides have beautiful covers and often include a Bible verse. All "our girls" have journals to record their prayers and any other writings or artwork they want to include. Their moms have journals. Women I encounter on and off the reservation have beautiful journals. When I give away a journal I often share my 'secret' of hearing God as I spend quiet time with Him. I encourage them to share their hearts with our Daddy God and then listen for His words to them.


