

Dennis and I attended a Love & Respect Conference in 2011. It was the most powerful and helpful counsel we have received for our marriage! We were so grateful for this teaching by Dr. Emerson Eggerich* and immediately purchased the Conference DVD set, knowing that others would benefit from these lessons. We showed the DVD Conference to our friends at AICM (the mission school we served at as dorm parents). We prayed earnestly for opportunities to share this teaching tool with folks on the White Mountain Apache Reservation. No doors opened at churches, with small groups or through local pastors. We prayed and waited.

Then, about a year ago I mentioned to my co-worker, Naomi, that we have this great marriage enrichment DVD set. She told me that she and her husband would really like to go through it! I lent it to her and they appreciated it. We talked about offering this teaching as part of our classes at the Living Hope Center in Whiteriver. Yes, we had *a few* married couples (verses most of our clients who are 'living together') coming for classes. They would certainly benefit from some encouragement for their marriage in addition to the parenting classes they were attending.

I asked a newly married couple when they came in for a parenting class, "Would you like to view the DVD on disciplining your children OR a lesson on enriching your marriage?" Knowing they weren't believers (yet) I added that it is based on principles in the Bible, but stated that it was very helpful as "God created marriage!" The husband immediately spoke up and said, "We'll do the marriage lesson!" Yeah!





God is at work in their marriage and the marriages of six other couples (including the Patten's shown left) who are working their way through the 6 DVD set of Love and Respect lessons. The teaching is simple, but not easy to implement! Husbands are to *love* their wives in a way that the wives *feel* loved....even when they are behaving in an unlovable manner! Wives are to *respect/show honor* to their husbands even when they are not acting respectable (with the exception of abuse, of course)! In the matriarchal society of the White Mountain Apaches the idea of respecting husbands being a

command from God is a foreign concept! One woman even spoke up and said that this is just a

suggestion from God as NO ONE is doing it! What a commentary on our world and the Reservation!

These women are learning to *allow the Holy Spirit to lead and teach them*. All are growing in faith and maturity as they gain work skills and Biblical life principles. Praise God for LIFE!

The Battle Between our "Flesh" and the Spirit continues!...by Dennis

I am sure kids are saying this off the reservations, but on the White Mountain Apache Reservation this saying is used frequently and with emotion. We heard once more, "I have to be true to myself; this is who I am," and it concerned an action that is unacceptable to Jesus. A teaching moment had arrived.

When non-believers say this, I find myself understanding the way they feel. It is not accurate, but it is something they think they are doing that is right and that they have a 'right" to feel this way. On the other hand, Christ-followers do not have the luxury of declaring this and using it as an excuse for behavior that does not conform to Jesus' principles.

The world tells us things like, "The truer you are to yourself, the greater your gifts will manifest themselves." 12 Keys to Success for Misfits, Weirdos & Introverts: A Practical and Spiritual Guide to Understanding Your Place in the World by Tiffany L. Jackson.

Also the world tells us, "Being true to yourself starts with knowing who you are and accepting yourself; knowing your strengths; passions, limitations and purpose in life and then living that way all the time; you come to know yourself only by living life; finding what works for you; what defines you and makes you whole, it is a personal choice for truth; means you don't worry about pleasing other people, no one can tell you how to be true to yourself except you; it is this simple — either you live in integrity or you live out of integrity." Many people (especially kids) that follow those principles wind up confused, in trouble, and feel they are being picked on, to name a few drawbacks. When you are following those principles you are living in the FLESH. And I don't know about you, but my living in the flesh may have gotten me a little bit of satisfaction and fun for a short time. However in the long run, it has brought nothing to me but pain, suffering, regret, and bad memories that I can't erase.

As a Christ-follower there is no choice. Christ-followers are to crucify the flesh (or sin nature) and die to self. The "dying to self" in the New Testament is the next step after accepting Christ. It means that we take up our cross and follow Christ. It is part of being born again; the old self dies and the new self comes to life. (see John 3:3–7).

Dying to self is a two-part commitment and part of our sanctification. Dying to self is both a one-time event and a lifelong process in the born-again believer. When self interferes with the principles of Jesus, only pain and hardship will follow immediately or eventually. So when a young person (or anyone) makes the comment about having to be true to yourself, incorporate it into a teaching moment and explain to them about walking in the Spirit instead of the flesh!

You can read scripture about our FLESH in Matthew 26:41, John 6:63, Romans 8:5, Galatians 5:16, Galatians 5:1-21 and Romans 8:13. (A longer version of this article is available upon request. Contact me at Dennis@ManosdeDios.org.)

Even though this is a difficult list to read, it is a good starting point to see if we are allowing the flesh to dominate any part of our life.

"When you follow the desires of your sinful nature, the results are very clear: sexual immorality, impurity, lustful pleasures, idolatry, sorcery, hostility, quarreling, jealousy, outbursts of anger, selfish ambition, dissension, division, envy, drunkenness, wild parties, and other sins like these. Let me tell you again, as I have before, that anyone living that sort of life will not inherit the Kingdom of

God." Galatians 5:19-21 (NLT)

"A life dominated by the flesh is a hard life. It is filled with excess, imbalance, laziness, selfabuse, hatred, strife, bitterness, irresponsibility and neglect. The flesh cries out to be in charge, screaming to have its own way, demanding to be the boss. Unless you take your flesh to the Cross and mortify it by the power of God, it will keep screaming until you finally surrender to it and allow it to produce its ruinous effects in your life."
