Drelyn, a junior at Desert Christian High School, enjoys living with Chaco (and us!) We brought Drelyn to Tucson to begin her junior year at Desert Christian High School. God hadn't provided a host family yet so we moved her into our home office building, converting one room into her bedroom. We didn't know how long we were to commit to being in Tucson, but we totally surrendered our time and our wills to God's plan. Then, Dennis' back surgery (scheduled for October 27) was moved up to August 19th!! He needed six weeks of recovery in Tucson, with my help. My Dad was scheduled for an MRI of his back and subsequently required at least one injection for leg pain and numbness. "OK, Lord. I know you want us here in Tucson for a period of time! Thank you for making that clear! We are yours. Use us. Our time is yours!"

So, Dennis and I are busy being 'parents' of a 16- year-old! Rides to and from school. Staying on top of homework. Packing lunches. Dinners. Youth Group. Friends. Monitoring Social Media! Whew! This will keep us young! "God, please give us

Your wisdom for this time!"

Drelyn is working hard at being a good student. She loves her Christian Perspectives class this year and she and Dennis have in-depth conversations about everything from the Bible to politics!

Drelyn and I get along very well. We talk, worship and pray. We work on the "issues" that she struggles with. It is obvious that God has Dennis and me here for "such a time as this"! We are resting in the Lord and cherishing this time in Tucson. Drelyn and I pray often for a host family, but trust that she is in our home now because it is God's will. **Thank you for continuing to pray with us for God's perfect will and timing...for His very best for Drelyn and for us!**

Last spring the decision was prayerfully made to have Thearsa (8th grade) and Naomi (7th grade) to live in separate homes this school year. These sisters, 11 months apart in age, had never lived apart. But, Sharon and Dan (their former host parents), Dennis and I and even Thearsa and Naomi themselves sensed it was time for them to become independent and grow into individuals. We prayed that God would provide the exact host families each girl needed.

During the summer the girls talked about having second thoughts about agreeing to live separately. But God was at work. Marty and Bobbi Brown were at their church the Sunday Dennis and I presented the need for host families. They reported that they each (independently) felt a tugging at their heart while we spoke. They prayed about offering their "empty nest" home to one of the students coming from the White Mountain Apache Reservation. Their four children had graduated from Desert Christian High School, but are grown and well into their careers. We met and felt that God was leading us to place Naomi in their home. Naomi came to Tucson and spent a couple nights with them this summer. It was a match made in heaven! Naomi now reports that she loves Bobbi and "Doc". She is thriving on the attention, independence and love.

Thearsa struggled with believing that God had a host family for her in Tucson. We prayed together and read verses about having faith. One week before school was to begin we received an email asking if a family with an 8th grade boy and a high school girl in the home would be a potential host family. We prayed, spoke with Thearsa's mom, and then responded, "Yes!" Applications were completed, references were checked and a home visit was completed. The Sunday before school began, Thearsa met her host family and the next day she moved into her room in their home. She is thriving in a busy household with siblings, a swimming pool and lots of support. "Lord, You are so awesome! Thank you for your work in these young ladies' lives. You have a plan and it is wonderful! Praise be Your Name!"


As Drelyn is living with us, we asked her to write an article for our Manos de Dios newsletter.
