Margarita and Alejandra: God has a plan!... by Lucy




Margarita teaches seamstress classes to DIF students in Puerto Peñasco

Thank you, God, for your plan and your perfect timing! Margarita has been doing some clothing alterations for the new mayor's wife, Maestra Rafaela, in Puerto Peñasco. Rafaela loves Margarita's work and asked if she would like to teach classes for the DIF ("Desorrolla Integral para la Familia" ie: Development Classes for Families) program. Each new mayor has the option to hire government employees for many positions. Rafaela arranged to have Margarita hired to teach seamstress classes to a group of women enrolled in a skills enhancement program.

Margarita is being paid for her teaching and can take daughter Alejandra with her. Not only is this providing income, but having this job with DIF should elevate Margarita on the list for receiving a piece of property. Each resident of Puerto Peñasco can receive plot of land in the barrio. The waiting list for a piece of land with connection to running water and electricity is very long. Favor will be given to those having jobs and those employed by the government.

Margarita hopes to obtain land in her name so she can some day have her own home. In the meantime, she is a blessing to these precious women with her joyful spirit, superb teaching and example of unconditional love toward her disabled daughter, Alejandra.




